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PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

11th November, 1986.

You will notice that this "Scoop" contains a note on the Sorrento Boat Harbour. Since that note was written 22/10/86 more progress has been made in relation to the Couta Boat Club participation in the safe boat Harbour.

- For those of you who were'nt able to attend the AGM, an outline plan 1) and description was tabled and after some discussion the Committee's decision to accept the Shire's invitation was ratified by the Members.
- The Committee has proceeded to formally reply to the Shire of Flinders, 2) confirming the Club's acceptance of the Invitation to participate.

The Boat Harbour is to subject of an Environmental Effects Statement, due for completion in December 1986. The plans then available will embody the Shire's proposals, and will incorporate the proposed facility for the Couta Boat Club. Until this plan is placed on Public Display (Shire Offices) we can only report to you the results of our discussions with the Authority(s) involved, and although the enclosed note broadly describes the Harbour and the Club involvement it is not intended to embrace all, or fully and totally, or accurately describe the current or future plan.

Application forms are currently available from the Shire for Berthing rights in the floating docks. Word has it that many applications are being received.

Finally, the Committee have decided to levy a \$10.00 Block entry fee for those wishing to compete in the Club Aggregate. This fee is to recoup some of the expenses associated with the conduct of races. Please forward your entry fee with your Declaration or direct to the Secretary.

SORRENTO BOAT HARBOUR PROPOSAL

Briefly!.....

The Flinders Shire has been invited by the Ministry of Planning & Environment to present a viable Boat Harbour Scheme for Sorrento environs, preparatory to a Public Hearing clearing the way for a construction programme targeted to conclude in line with Australia's Bicentennial. (1988)

The Shire has commissioned and costed a schematic Harbour design $\underline{\text{broadly}}$ incorporating the following elements -

- * Location: between pier and present baths
- * Limited wet berths for 250 boats
- No dry storage
- * An endeavour to overcome the bases for previous rational environmental objections (e.g. by re-establishing more beach frontage than currently exists)
- * A ratio of 50% private secure berthing area to 50% public land component
- * Meeting a variety of practical design criteria and aesthetic constraints
- * Establishing limited commercial outlets e.g. Chandlery, Restaurant, Fresh Fish Outlet, Boat Sales
- * Maintaining existing Ferry Service, and allowing for Vehicular Ferry Licence. (in existence)

The Shire, with whom your Committee has conducted discussions regarding perceived future requirements for the Couta Boat Club, has recently invited the Club to participate in the Boat Harbour.

The Couta Boat Club has been offered the opportunity to take up an area within the Harbour proposal for the purposes of establishing a Club Facility - comprised of the following -

- 1) Clubhouse, possibly including starting facilities etc
- 2) Storage area (racing bouys and equipment etc)
- Limited secured yard/garden
- 4) * Static Display/Museum (Models, photos, memorabilia etc)
- 5) * Working Display area with a boat under restoration or construction
- * The latter two elements support Ministry of Planning and Victorian Tourism Commission stated objectives.

Further there would be available nearby berthing facilities for Club use such as loading etc. A careening ramp plus small crane for boat handling is intended and would also be located in a position convenient for Club Members use. It is proposed that an exclusive mooring area for Couta Boats (only) be established in the closest area immediately <u>outside</u> the Harbour, with the possibility of the sea wall affording limited protection. No other Clubs or Associations are being extended accomodation within the Harbour proposal.

Your Committee has decided to pursue the opportunities for the Club embodied in the proposal and intends to make a suitable response to the Shire as soon as practical.
